After the first reading, we use a very special prayer from the Psalms, a collection of 150 prayers for all occasions that have been recited by believers for over three thousand years including Jesus. These Psalms are used even today to pray. At each Mass one is said to praise the Lord. All are invited to respond out loud. The response is meant to highlight the readings and the gospel. If you are interested in praying with the Psalms, they can be found on-line at iBreviary.com, a wonderful site that gives us all the Psalms, readings and prayers of the day.
