# 1<sup>ST</sup> SUNDAY OF ADVENT

As Christians, we are people who live in hope, knowing that, while this life isn't going to last forever, there is something even more wonderful awaiting us. This doesn't mean that we are to live our lives detached from this world. Today's Gospel speaks of people eating and drinking, grinding meal, working the fields. Ordinary people living ordinary lives. And it is precisely into this very ordinariness that Jesus comes

When Jesus tells us to stay awake, he's not just pointing to the end of time. He's also inviting us to live in the present moment, to be attentive to the many ordinary ways he enters our daily lives.
