REFLECTION

1 Peter 4:9-10 Be hospitable to one another without complaining. Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received.

To be perfectly honest, I'm often hospitable with complaining, like Martha, Jesus' friend. I tend to sign up for a lot of things and then complain when no one seems to be helping me. I gripe about having to prep and bring a hot dish to pot luck. I am irritated when I get stuck lugging the heaviest item (bottled water) to our breakfast ministry. I am annoyed that I have to clean my house to host my husband's friends for dinner.

And, also, after ninety-five percent of these ordeals, I leave feeling inspired and happy that my gift of hospitality was used for the sake of friendship, community and love of neighbour. I have learned that hospitality does not need to be perfect to be felt by the recipient, only offered with joy. In Peter's advice, I hear encouragement. "Cut out your complaining and offer your gift. You know you'll end up really enjoying this."

Peace was a pretty big deal for Jesus. He talked about it a lot, and when he first appeared to the disciples after the resurrection, that was His greeting: "Peace be with you".
